## **IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT OBJECTIONS TO PERMIT APPLICATIONS**

1. This form is to help you make an objection to a planning application in accordance with the *Planning and Environment Act 1987* ('Act'). Council is the Responsible Authority under the Act to administer and enforce the Planning Scheme that applies in the City of Glen Eira.
2. Please ensure you inspect the application plans and any supporting documentation online via Council's website at [www.gleneira.vic.gov.au/advertplans](http://www.gleneira.vic.gov.au/advertplans). The plans are also available to view at Council's offices. Make sure you clearly understand what is proposed before you make an objection.
3. To make an objection you must provide the information requested on this form and lodge it with Council, as the Responsible Authority. An objection can be uploaded online via [www.gleneira.vic.gov.au/submission](http://www.gleneira.vic.gov.au/submission)
4. An objection must state:
  - the reasons for your objection; and
  - how you would be affected if a permit is granted.
5. The Responsible Authority may reject an objection if it considers that it has been made primarily to secure or maintain a direct or indirect commercial advantage for the objector. In this case, the Act applies as if the objection had not been made.
6. If your objection relates to property other than at your address as shown on your objection form, please clearly state your interest in it (i.e you own the land but do not live there).
7. To ensure that the Responsible Authority considers your objection, it must be received by the date stated in either a published Public Notice – Application for Planning Permit, in a notice displayed at the application site, or in a Notice of Application sent to you by the Responsible Authority.
8. If, despite your objection, the Responsible Authority decides to grant the permit, you can appeal against the decision. Information about appeal procedures are set out on the back of the Notice of Decision that you will receive. An appeal must be made in the prescribed form (available from VCAT) and accompanied by the prescribed fee. A copy of the appeal must be given to the Responsible Authority. The closing date for appeals is 21 days after the Responsible Authority has given notice of its decision.
9. Please also be advised that if your objection is on behalf of more than one person (i.e. containing multiple signatories), the Responsible Authority's correspondence will normally be directed only to the first signatory.

## **PRIVACY AND THIS OBJECTION**

This objection will be made available for public viewing at Council and copies may be made and provided for interested parties to enable consideration and review as part of the planning process under the Planning and Environment Act 1987.

In submitting your objection you consent to it being used and made available in Council's planning process as described here.
